

Making Futures CIC City & Guilds programmes Terms & Conditions

Enrolment

When participants enroll they will acknowledge that they have read these terms and conditions and will abide by them.

Making Futures reserves the right to refuse enrolment to any prospective participant.

City & Guilds programmes – Accreditation and Assessment

Making Futures CIC (Making Futures) is an accredited centre of Artybird Carnforth. Participants in Making Futures programmes will be registered with the awarding body, City & Guilds London.

The City & Guilds Certificate will only be awarded on satisfactory completion of the full programme and is subject to external verification in accordance with the requirements of City & Guilds as the awarding body.

Making Futures reserve the right to fail participants who do not meet the assessment criteria or address issues identified in individual feedback and action plans.

Participants have the right to appeal against assessment decisions, details are provided in the Making Futures Appeals Procedure (available on request)

Making Futures does not tolerate plagiarism; if participants are proven to have presented work that is not their own, they will be removed from the programme immediately.

Where participants imitate another artistic style, whilst clearly stating sources and inspiration, this is acceptable.

All work submitted on a programme of study must be current, i.e., not used before on another programme. This does not include certain samples that move with the participant from different levels within the same craft title. Work done on external workshops is encouraged and can form part of the student's portfolio – showing an extension of skill and knowledge.

Should a participant wish to replace a lost or damaged certificate they can order a replacement. There will be a £30 charge for this.

Fees and charges

Participants will, on enrolment, pay the programme fee, to include registration and certification with City & Guilds.

Should a participant choose not to complete the course, registration and certification fees are not refundable.

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No refund can be given on a programme fee if a participant chooses to leave part way through a programme of study. Should the pathway not be completed within the tuition time, Making Futures will charge £30 to mark each outstanding module.

Where payment is made in instalments (where available) subsequent modules will be made available upon receipt of the relevant instalment.

Prices are liable to change at the discretion of Making Futures but will be held for individuals for the period of enrolment as agreed at the time of enrolment.

Timeframes

It is anticipated that programmes may be comfortably completed in the following timeframes:

- Introduction Level – 6 months
- Foundation Level - 1 year
- Intermediate & Advanced – 2 years.

However, you will have access to the materials for a further year, should extra time be needed. This will not incur extra fees.

Student work

Making Futures will keep a copy of all assessment work throughout the duration of the programme.

Making Futures will respond as quickly as possible to an enquiry or assessment feedback. This will occur within 3 weeks of receiving the correspondence.

Making Futures may wish, from time to time, to reproduce images of participants' work for use on its website, on social media and in other promotional material. In accepting these terms and conditions you give permission for you and your work to be photographed, and to feature in the gallery and on the website and social media, appropriately credited to you.

Participants who do not wish to have their work used for these purposes should notify Making Futures on enrolment. Should a participant prefer to withhold their full name they should notify Making Futures on enrolment.

Making Futures will not take responsibility for the unauthorised publication of work featured in the website or on any social media platform.

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Health & safety

No responsibility can be accepted by Making Futures for any accident or injury sustained when a participant is engaged in course work. Participants are responsible for following appropriate health and safety guidelines with regard to any processes or products used in completing coursework.

Participants must have suitable insurance for any activities where this is a requirement by law.
